Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations

Catholics are to observe the following practices during Lent unless for some serious reason they are unable to do so:

Fasting Catholics from age 18-59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On a fast day, individuals are allowed one full meal and two smaller meals, with no snacking in between meals.

Abstinence Catholics 14 years of age and older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all other Fridays of Lent.
