† <u>From Fr. David</u> This Sunday-Monday I am hosting my priest support group at the rectory in Lake Mills. We meet about every 2 months for prayer, academic discussion, socializing, and support. Every once in a while a new priest will "check out" our group, without making a commitment, and we will have such a new person this weekend. I am very grateful for my support group. ►If any readers missed the small "reader meetings" that we had after Masses last weekend, please contact me, and I will review the points we covered. If anyone is interested in becoming a new reader, please contact me—we are looking for more readers!

Why do we pray for the dead? Some non-Catholics are uncomfortable with this practice. To them, it seems like we are praying for their salvation, and a person's salvation is already determined by the time they die. After they die, it is too late for them to repent and believe in Christ, so why pray for them? The answer is that we Catholics agree that a person can't convert after they die, but we also believe that God's people (those destined for heaven) in most cases must undergo purification after they die and before they come to God's immediate presence (Matthew 5:8, I Cor 3:15). How much time is the purifying process, what is the nature of it, where does it happen, does it cause suffering? These are all mysteries, and we can only speculate without knowing for sure. We pray for the dead because our prayers help them in the purification process. The greatest prayer for the dead is the Eucharistic Prayer. Each of

the EPs has a section near the end where we pray for the dead. We are also encouraged to pray, as individuals and families, for our departed loved ones, even at their graves. One traditional prayer is "May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen." Prayer for the dead is found in the Old Testament (2 Macc 12:46) and in the New (2 Tim 1:18). Since scriptural support is not common, most non-Catholics don't practice it. It has, however, been part of the Church since the beginning (CCC#1032). It is not possible for us to know whether a person is in need of purification when they die, just as it is not possible to know whether they are destined for heaven or hell. Jesus will decide those destinies at his second coming (Matthew 25:32). We believe that prayers for the dead will only benefit those destined for heaven-- prayer will not benefit those who are destined for hell (CCC#1035). We live in hope that our loved ones are destined for eternal life with God, and that we are, too. Thus, we pray for them even though we don't know with certainty their eternal destiny.
